The Youth Peer Mentor's Work Week

During the twenty hours the Youth Peer Mentors are engaged in work related to *Moving Forward*, they will have a variety of responsibilities. Upon hiring, much of their work week will be filled with training and orientation so they are fully aware of their role within the initiative, their responsibilities as a peer supporter and rules governing their relationship with their mentees.

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During a "typical" twenty hour work week at an agency at which a Peer is engaging in TIP case based work, the Peer can expect to spend:

- 4 hours in team meetings
- 2 hours on administrative duties (documentation, logs, scheduling, timesheets)
- 2 hours planning youth activity or consulting with agency staff on youth engagement.
- 1.5 hours researching available resources/making connections with local community resources
- 1 hour a week supervision with Operations Coordinator
